

Week 4: Welcome + Workshop format

Theme: Oceans

Learning aids used throughout workshop:

Book - How to Catch a Star by Oliver Jeffers Book - The Snail and the Whale by Julia Donaldson

Activity: Ocean Scene

15 mins

Materials: PVA glue, cardboard boxes, sandpaper, shells, pebbles, blue tissue paper, blue paint, newspaper, card, blue or clear string, plastic food bags, googley eyes, coloured tissue paper.

Senses Explored: Visual, tactile.

Step by Step:

- 1. Cut off flaps of cardboard box and paint box blue
- 2. Cut a large rectangular hole at the top to let in light at the back of the box. Cover it with translucent blue tissue paper
- 3. Glue sandpaper, shells, pepples etc to floor
- 4. Scrunch up newpaper and pva glue it. Once hard paint a rock colour. Stick to corner of box
- 5. Make fish and starfish from card and paint. Tie string to hang from top of box
- 6. To make a jellyfish get a plastic food bag and fill a little of coloured tissue paper into it. Screw and leave the plastic to flow downwards cut into strips to create tentacles
- 7. Glue on goggley eyes and hang like above

Activity: Octopus and Starfish

Materials: 4 pairs of tights, newspaper, wool, elastic band, googley eyes, glue gun, large card, sand.

Learning Outcome: Sharing and working together.

Senses Explored: Visual, tactile.

Step by Step:

Octopus

- 1. Stuff 7 legs of the tights with paper and tie into one at top
- 2. Stuff the top of the tights with wool and attach to the legs with an elastic band
- 3. Add goggley eyes with glue gun

Starfish

- 1. Cut large star shape from card
- 2. Spread PVA Glue all over
- 3. Sprinkle sand over the glue

Activity: Ocean Motion! (printmaking book)

Materials: Mark / print making tools such as string, fish netting, shells, pebbles, sand, sea weed, sea vegetables, and any other objects relating to the ocean.

Senses Explored: Visual, chromatic, tactile.

Method:

The children will use a variety of found beach / sea objects to produce a visual interpretation of the motion the ocean makes. No paintbrushes allowed!

Step by Step:

- 1. Using the found objects, dip into paint and mark make onto paper. Its that simple!
- 2. A4 sheets are used and put together to create a print making book with title on top of what was used. Later in the course more prints will be added to this book.

Activity: Paper Plate Fish

Materials: Paper plates, foil papers in different colours shaped into scales, glue stick, googley eyes, scissors, thread.

Learning Outcome: That many fish eat little fish (something humans don't do) **Senses Explored:** Visual, tactile.

Step by Step:

- 1. Cut triangle (pizza slice shape) out of paper plate for wide open mouth
- 2. Use this triangle as the tail (back to front). Stick with tape.
- 3. Glue on scales and googley eyes.
- 4. Make a mini fish and tie inside open mouth by hanging from string.

Activity: Shark Card

Materials: 2 rectangle cards – one white and one coloured, crayons, googley eyes **Learning Outcome:** 3D effects

Senses Explored: Visual, tactile.

Step by Step: (1 – 5 pre-done for toddlers)

- 1. Fold card in half (like a greeting card)
- 2. Cut slit inwards (approx 5 inches) about halfway down the length of the card
- 3. Fold into triangle shape and open card wide to push out the triangle shape so that it eventually forms an open mouth of a shark
- 4. Close card again and fold down card to strengthen mouth
- 5. Cut teeth shapes into open mouth using a zig zag scissors (optional)
- 6. Glue second card onto front (outside only careful not to glue the mouth!)
- 7. Decorate card outside is the sea and inside is the shark
- 8. Place the googley eyes above the open mouth to resemble the shark swimming towards the person opening the card!

Activity: Decorating Clay Egg from last week

Materials: paint, thin brush and hardened clay egg from last week Learning Outcome: modelling and construction Senses Explored: Visual, tactile. Step by Step:

1. Paint eggs!!!
